


2016 Annual Report

Our mission is to eliminate the preventable euthanasia of companion animals and community cats through high-quality, low-cost spay/neuter and wellness services, by supporting rescue, and promoting responsible pet ownership.

How We Helped Animal Shelters and Rescue Groups in 2016

- A total of **16 animal shelters and rescue groups** utilized H.O.P.E. for spay/neuter/vaccination services for pets in their care.
- H.O.P.E. provided transport of animals **for 7 different animal shelters** in Indiana, Michigan, and Ohio. This is called our Transport Program where we drive to shelters and bring their adoption animals back to our clinic for surgery.
- Over half of the spay/neuter surgeries we provided in 2016 were for shelter or rescue animals, totaling **5,500 animals!**

How We Helped Community Cats in 2016



In addition to helping thousands of pet owners and their dogs and cats each year, we also make a point to provide help for animals without owners.

As part of our mission to eliminate preventable euthanasia in our community, H.O.P.E. focuses on providing help for **community cats** (feral cats) by offering low cost packages for care takers, resources, and educational opportunities like our Feline Fall Festival. We have made an enormous impact on the lives of feral cats in our community. Since opening our doors in 2010, we have spayed or neutered over 12,000 community cats! This effort is reducing intake and euthanasia numbers at our local shelters and is saving lives every day.

How We Helped Animals in 2016

- 9,740** Spay/neuter surgeries provided
- 5,500** Shelter pets helped
- 2,640** Community Cats no longer breeding
- 16,267** Vaccinations given
- 4,816** Visits to our Wellness Clinic
- 3,956** Pets are now microchipped
